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
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

COST action objectives

The main objectives of the COST Action are:

Mapping:

Identifying ethical challenges in dementia care across Europe and outlining principles for addressing them.

Development:

Proposing a practical European ethics framework for dementia care.

Recommendations:

Crafting policy suggestions for integrating this framework into European healthcare systems.

Education:

Creating an EDEM toolkit to assist caregivers in making ethical decisions, relevant for both formal and informal caregivers.

European collaboration:

Promoting long-term partnerships to advance dementia ethics research among researchers and stakeholders.

The Working Groups

The EDEM objectives will be achieved through 5 Working Groups (WGs).

All members of the Action will be encouraged to join two or more of the WGs, corresponding to their knowhow and scientific interests.

The tasks of the WGs will foster mutual knowledge of one another and move toward attaining the common aim of the Action.
